2. Minutes of the previous meeting:

3. Matters Arising:

KS spoke with Shrivenham Farmers Market, no particular person or group available to help, we have to organize ourselves. KS to ask AD for assistance.

4. Celebration of the Arts 2010:

Peter Arnell organizing Highworth Year of Culture with HTC backing. Open with a concert in January and events each month throughout the year. A brochure and calendar of events to be produced. There will be an Open Meeting in due course. A book is to be published to celebrate the present Highworth (2010). We should apply for grants from SBC (Helen Miah, Arts and Culture) towards it. Historical Society thinking of May Day Celebrations (possible date 3.5.10) with medieval market, maybe civil war enactment, costumes. Hopefully we can use an empty shop front to publicize events

5. Fox Roundabout update:

The Festival committee have backed use of £3,000 raised (possibly more) towards the Fox Roundabout. KS to draw up plans then Festival committee to go to HTC who will then present to SBC as one of the Town Plan projects. Suggest we ask Arkells Brewery to sponsor a Fox sculpture for the centre of the roundabout. Permission only needed as Festival committee, HCPG and HBG will fund. PH to do brief plan for KS

6. Chairman's Report:

- MUGA /Skatepark (Costing is approx £150-165K) Youth Group Committee meeting (Pauline Webster, Peter Robinson, Area Manager for Children's Services) £1.1m was available for urban areas which has already been used up but decided that a further £100k available, £50k for Parish Councils to bid for. David Lane has been asked to bid. A further £17,950 is available from 106 monies to be used in Education, eligible to ask for money, therefore a possible £68k available to bid for. There is also a Youth Capital Venture Fund that Youth can apply for. 2 locations shortlisted: favoured Westrop School field, near to Youth Centre and new Assessment Centre. Second Barra Close, which would not be suitable. If it were to be put at the Rec, we could apply for Grass Roots Grant. The £50k grant from SBC has to be spent within 2 years.
