4. Locality Team Input:

Now looking for funding from Freke Norton, Lions etc. Rosie will be self-employed on £20k for two years, she will also report to a project board for guidance and support. Could HCPG/HCA hold this money? Better to use HCA as a charity, they will raise at their next meeting 7/6, but don't think there will be a problem. We will meet with Warneford School after 23rd June. The Business Plan will be presented to HTC on 16/6 and to Churches Together on 17/6.

7. WFCAP – IW attended a meeting at Bradford on Avon. The Hub previously a Lloyds Bank has a church above. Also deal with Time Credits, earn credits by doing voluntary work which you can then spend in sports centres etc. Local Council is involved whereas big businesses are not. SBC has piloted a similar project 'Timebank', earn one place spend elsewhere. Difficult in practice. IW also watched a demonstration on 'Smart Water' (cost £60 a go), a new version of the invisible pen which helps to prevent crime. Melksham managed to get it for half price with the Police Commission Board paying towards it. Check with Neighbourhood Watch if in existence in this area and whether we could get discount (Melksham willing to assist us).
